Preparing for post-secondary education – The Academic Research Paper

Exploring the World's History, Identity and Culture

The research paper is the most challenging task students encounter in senior history courses (as well as post-secondary programs). Writing a sound historical research essay requires an ability to carry out in-depth research, make effective notes, formulate and defend a clear thesis, apply critical, analytical and creative thinking skills, and organize information in a logical and coherent fashion. On top of all of this, a formal essay must be effectively written and accurately documented.

Students will select essay topics of particular interest to them. Select a topic carefully. Topics that focus on other disciplines or on current events are not likely to be approved – there must be appropriate research material available to you.

Maintaining a Processfolio

To ensure your greatest success and to safeguard against plagiarism, all students are advised to maintain a *Processfolio*. The *Processfolio* is a collection (in a folder) of work you complete as your essay progresses.

Research Paper Specifications

Your research paper **MUST** adhere to the following specifications:

- ✓ 1500-2000 words
- ✓ double-spaced, typed 12-point, Times New Roman font OR Arial font
- ✓ Every page (except the cover page) must be numbered in the upper, right hand corner.
- ✓ Use properly formatted **FOOTNOTES (APA - Chicago Style)**
- ✓ Have a bibliography in APA - Chicago Style that cites at least four academic books/articles¹ and **no more than two academic websites** (NOT Wikipedia!!).
