Evacuation from Dunkirk, 1940


- British and French troops, early into the war, are pushed to the coast by German panzer (tank) units to Dunkirk, a seaport on the French Coast.
- Hitler, listening to Hermann Göring, wanted the *Luftwaffe* to destroy these allied troops, but cloud cover prevented the bombing.
- For nine days the British navy, as well as civilian helpers, evacuated over 300,000 men from the beaches of Dunkirk.

Why was allowing this evacuation to happen an error?


The London Blitz (bombing of London), 1940

- During the Battle of Britain, the Luftwaffe accidentally bombed London instead of RAF (Royal Air Force) airfields.
- Winston Churchill (Prime Minister of Great Britain) retaliated by having the RAF bomb Berlin.
- Hitler, embarrassed and upset, orders London bombed for two months.

Why was exclusively bombing London an error?

Operation Barbarossa (Invasion of Russia), 1941

- On June 22nd, 1941, the Third Reich invaded the Soviet Union. For the Soviets this triggered **The Great Patriotic War** a fight for the survival of the Soviet Union in the face of a Nazi invasion.
- 3.8 million personnel of the Axis powers—the largest invasion force in the history of warfare—invaded the western Soviet Union along a 2,900-kilometer (1,800 mi) front, with 600,000 motor vehicles and over 600,000 horses for non-combat operations.

- Germans and Soviets engage in the **Battle of Stalingrad** as part of a long, costly, and brutal war.
